The condition of the above obligation is such  
 that if the said Bell Gullion Administratrix  
 of the Estate Goods Chattels and credits of  
 Josephiah Gullion deceased do make a true  
 and perfect Inventory of all and singular the  
 Goods Chattels and credits of the said deceased  
 which have or shall come to the hands poss-  
 ession or knowledge of her the said Bell  
 Gullion, or into the hands or possession of any  
 other person or persons for her, and the same  
 do make do exhibit into the county court  
 of Gallatin county when she shall be thereto  
 required by the said Court, and such Goods  
 Chattels and credits do well and truly admin-  
 ister according to Law, and further do make  
 a just and true account of her actings and  
 doings therein when there to required by the  
 said Court, and all the rest of the said  
 Goods Chattels and credits which shall be  
 found remaining upon the account of the  
 said Administratrix the same being first  
 examined and allowed by the Justices of

The said cause for the three being shall be  
-liver and pay unto such persons respectively  
as are entitled to the same by Law; and if it  
shall hereafter appear that any bond will  
and testament was made by the said deceased  
and the same be proved in court and the ex-  
-tor thereof obtain a certificate of the probate  
thereof; and the said Bell Gullion shall in  
such case, being required, render and deliver up her  
letters of administration then this obligation to

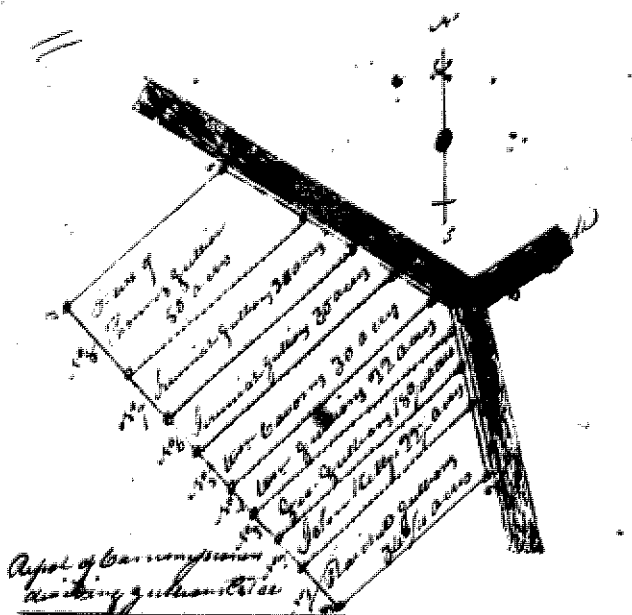

 1819 The undersigned being appointed  
 by the County Court of said County  
 as Commissioner to divide the  
 said Estate of James Gullett  
 dec'd, amongst the heirs of  
 said Gullett dec'd. see being  
 duly sworn as the Law directs  
 met at the house of Messrs  
 Lewis Laidlaw & Co. said James  
 Gullett dec'd. equally to appoint  
 met on the 9th day of Aug.

1819, we proceeded to run the above described land as said, shown  
 by the black drawn line, beginning at the figure one and thence to  
 2. 3. 4. & 5. from thence to the beginning, being furnished with a  
 Certified Copy of said Survey; we then proceeded to mark the differ-  
 ent divisions as laid down in the above annexed plat, thence  
 by the dotted lines distinguished by their N. 1. 2. 3. 4. 5. 6. 7. & 8.  
 which said lots, or parcels of land, as laid down, with the  
 exception of Lot N. 8, containing 50 acres, as laid down  
 for the heirs of Thomas Gullett dec'd, it being a part of the  
 Survey made to Thomas Gullett in his life time, by way of bond  
 of conveyance to him or his heirs &c, it being presumed and
